SAINT OF THE WEEK

St John Bosco celebrated on 31st January

John Bosco was born in 1815, the son of a poor farmer, in a little village in Italy called Becchi. From a very early age John wanted to become a priest. Following his studies he was finally ordained in 1841 and was called Don Bosco, which means Father Bosco in Italian. After his ordination to the priesthood, he began working in Turin. He was shocked when he saw how many children had no homes. When he offered to help one young boy, six friends came with him. Gradually the numbers grew. Don Bosco played football with them, and cooked for them. He taught them skills such as carpentry and tailoring, and gave them hope for the future. Later he built orphanages and provided the boys with a home. He soon realised he could not do this by himself. In 1859 he founded a religious order, which is now known as the Salesians of Don Bosco. He also helped found the Salesian Sisters who worked with the girls. He told them "Always live in the presence of God. Be gentle, patient and kind. Help your girls to love God with all their hearts."

When Don Bosco died on 31st January 1888, the streets of Turin were lined with thousands of mourners. Today the work of Don Bosco has spread. Members of the Salesian Family continue to educate and care for young people throughout the world.
