Third Sunday in Lent

Gospel: John 4:5-42

In this Sunday's reading we hear a story about Jesus talking to a Samaritan woman at a well. This story reminds us that God loves all people no matter where they are from. God asks us to be like Jesus and to respect and care for all people no matter who they are.

Jesus is thirsty and so he asks a Samaritan woman for a drink from the well.

The woman is surprised because normally Jews and Samaritans did not get along. It was also unusual at the time for a man to talk to a woman he did not know.

But even though it is unusual, Jesus talks to the woman anyway. Why do you think he does this?

Jesus is showing us that God loves everyone. No matter who they are or where they come from – man or woman, boy or girl, rich or poor, black or white.

Jesus shows the woman that he is Christ, the Son of God, by knowing all about her life even though he has never met her before.

How do you think this makes the woman feel?

Infectious diseases reminder

If your child has a sticky eye, diarrhoea, vomiting, ring worm etc. do take them to the doctors for treatment before they return to school to help prevent the disease spreading. Your child should remain at home for at least 48 hours since they last vomited or had diarrhoea. If your child has a rash, we will need evidence from your doctor to confirm that your child is not contagious.
