Fourth Sunday in Lent

Gospel: John 9: 1 - 41

This Sunday we hear how Jesus helps a blind man to see again. God has given us the gift of sight to see all the wonderful things that he has made in our world. But we also need to open our eyes to things that are wrong and try to do what we can to change them. Let's think some more about this today. Jesus makes a paste, puts it on the blind man's eyes and tells him to wash in a pool. When the blind man does this he can see. How do you think the blind man felt at being able to see for the first time? The Pharisees (some of the religious leaders of the time) question the man and his parents to find out how Jesus gave him his sight. The man tells them but they do not believe it and grow angry. Jesus tells the Pharisees that they are blind because they cannot see that he is the Son of God. God has given us five senses to learn about the world that is around us. Do you know what those five senses are? We can see all the beautiful and wonderful things that God has created like birds, trees, flowers, fish, family and friends. We can hear lovely music or the birds singing. We can smell flowers and the sea and grass when it has just been cut. We can taste yummy food and drink. We can feel the sun warm on our skin, or the softness of a pet when we stroke it. Can you think of some of the wonderful things in our world that you have seen, heard, smelt, tasted or felt today? Sometimes there are problems or things that are not right in this world. We can take notice of these problems and try to make them better. For example, we can see that it is not fair that some people do not have a job and so cannot earn a living and support themselves and their families, whilst other people have lots of money, food and clothes. We can see that it is not fair that some children cannot go to school because their families have to spend all their money on buying food. Can you think of any other problems in our world? God calls us to use our gifts and not to ignore these problems. We can try instead to make a difference so that around the world people who are poor can also change their lives for the better. What do you think you might do to make a difference? What one good thing, and one thing that is wrong about the world, are you going to look out for this week?
