### St Charles Borromeo

#### Celebrated on 4<sup>th</sup> November

Charles Borromeo was born in 1538 into one of the most influential families in Italy. But of all the great people in the family he was probably the most outstanding. He was born in a town by the name of Arona, situated on the southern shore of Lake Maggiore in Northern Italy. Charles began his studies at the University of Milan and was an exceptional student. He was given great responsibility in the Church even before he was ordained. Because of his ability and wealthy connections, he could have made a career in managing the Church's property. He decided however he would like to become a priest. Very soon he was consecrated as Bishop of Milan.

As a bishop, he dedicated himself totally to the care of his diocese and his people. He realised that a good diocese needed good priests, so he set about looking after them. He also encouraged the priests, in their turn, to look after their parishioners. He was not afraid to correct those who had jobs in the Church, but were not diligent in their work.

He built seminaries, where new priests could be trained for the priesthood. He also supported the mission work of the religious orders in the diocese. In this way he brought many people back to the practice of their faith. It was the example of his own life which impressed people. He never asked his priests to do anything he wasn't prepared to do himself. The people loved and admired him for it.

Day and night, Charles showed personal concern for the sick and the dying, especially during the long months of the plague, when many thousands of people in Milan died. Totally exhausted by the work, he often neglected to his own health, sometimes eating just bread and water. The dedication to his people totally weakened him and Charles died at the age of forty-six on the 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1584.
