This Sunday's reading – Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel: Matthew 25:1-13

Jesus tells a story about ten people who are waiting at a wedding for the bridegroom to arrive. It is dark and so they all have lamps with them to light the way. But what did five of them have that the other five didn't? Five of them were sensible and took extra oil with them, so that if the bridegroom was late they would still be able to light his way. They were prepared.

What happened next?

The bridegroom was very late. It was after midnight before the ten people were asked to go out and meet him and five of them no longer had enough oil for their lamps. They were not prepared and ended up being left outside the wedding.

How do you think they felt about being left outside?

Sometimes things happen that we don't expect and we realise that we are not ready for them. Can you think of a time when this has happened to you? What happened? How did you feel?

Can you think of a time when you were ready for something? When you were well prepared? What happened? How did you feel?

We know that God's kingdom will come. But we don't know exactly when. In today's reading, Jesus is telling us we should be prepared, so we are ready and waiting when he comes again.

How do you think we can make sure we are prepared for the coming of God's kingdom?
