Our Meals and Other Debt Policy is on our website. Please take the time to read it as we cannot use school funds provided by the government for the education of children, to pay for chargeable goods and/or services provided, including school meals. School meals this half term is £58.00 until 25<sup>th</sup> May. All school meals should be paid for in advance. There are quite a few parents/carers who are not paying for meals at the beginning of the week and therefore are accruing a debt. We will be ringing to arrange for a packed lunch to be brought in until the debt is cleared.

## Fourth Sunday of Easter (Year B)

**Gospel:** John 10:11-18

In the Gospel reading Jesus tells a story. He calls himself the good shepherd, who cares for his sheep. This story shows us that Jesus knows and cares for all people. Let's think about how we can care for all people too, no matter where they are in the world.

Jesus calls himself the good shepherd, who carefully looks after his sheep. Why do you think Jesus calls himself a shepherd?

Who do you think the sheep are that Jesus talks about in this story?

When he says sheep, Jesus means us, because he cares for us and for all people around the world.

How does it make you feel to know that Jesus loves and cares for you that much?

If a wolf came to attack the sheep in a field, someone who did not care about them would run away, and the sheep would scatter. But Jesus loves his sheep so much he is prepared to die to save them from danger! Sometimes it can be very difficult to stop someone or something that we do not like or that we know is wrong. We might be afraid that we will be hurt or laughed at.

Have you ever felt like running away and hiding instead of standing up for someone? What happened? What did you do?

There are many things that happen in the world that are not right. Can you think of some? There are people around the world who have been forced to leave their homes because of fighting. There are people who do not have enough food to eat or clean water to drink. There are children who have to work and earn money to help support their families instead of going to school. Do you think this is fair? How does this make you feel?

Jesus wants us to follow his example. He asks us to care for all our brothers and sisters around the world, no matter who they are or where they come from. And he doesn't want us to run away when things are difficult. He wants us to stand up for what we believe and know to be right. Jesus loves everybody the same amount, no matter where in the world they are from. How do you think we can do the same and show our love for everybody throughout the world?

How will you stand up for what you know is right and show your love for our global family this week?
