Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 4:26-34

In the gospel reading we hear about a tiny little seed. But when it is planted it grows into a big bush with branches big enough for all the birds to come and sit in. Let's think a bit more about what Jesus was trying to say with this story. Jesus is trying to show us what God's Kingdom is like. It's not easy to describe, so instead he tells us stories so that we can try to imagine it.

Both the stories he tells are about seeds. We're going to think about the story of the mustard seed. What do you remember about this story?

The mustard seed is a tiny little seed. But it grows into a very big bush with very big branches. Big enough for birds to be able to come and sit in and get out of the sun.

So, what do you think Jesus is trying to tell us? Perhaps it's that size doesn't matter – even the tiniest seed can produce a great big tree. And the same is true for us – even the smallest person can do great things. And even the smallest action can have big results.

For example, being kind in the playground and inviting someone to play with you if they look lonely, is just one little thing you can do – it hardly takes any time at all. But to the person who is lonely, it can make a really big difference.

Can you think of any examples of small things that you have done that have made a real difference to other people?

What do you think happens when lots of people join their actions together?

If lots of people do something small, it can make a really, really big difference. A bit like how a drop of water isn't very much on its own, but join it together with thousands of other drops, and you get the great big sea!

Together, small actions add up to make a big difference.

The smallest seed can grow into the biggest bush.

What small actions will you take this week to make a difference to other people?
