Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 5:21-43

In the Gospel reading we hear about two of the healing miracles of Jesus. We learn about Jesus' kindness and understanding. Jesus heals two people on the same day but in very different circumstances.

The woman in the story had been ill for a long time whilst the little girl has just been taken ill. Did this make any difference to how Jesus cared for them?

If we were ill what would happen? We would expect to be able to go to see a doctor or, at least, get medicine from the chemist. Can everyone in the world do this?

There are many people around the world who cannot get to see a doctor when they need to. The nearest clinic or hospital may be a very long way away. Or they might not have enough money to pay to see the doctor.

How do you think you would feel if you were sick, or a member of your family was sick and you couldn't see a doctor?

Many children are not able to grow up to be healthy because of illnesses caught from unclean water and because they do not have enough good food to eat.

The Church helps people by opening new clinics for mothers, babies and children so that they do not fall ill and can get help when they need it.

Jesus was willing to help anyone who asked. As followers of Jesus we should also do our best to help people who are in need, so that they can grow up happy and healthy.
