### Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

In this week's Gospel reading we hear how Jesus valued children and thought they were important. Let's think about how important all children around the world are today.

In the reading Jesus shows the disciples how important children are. Can you remember what Jesus says?

Jesus says that anyone who welcomes a child, welcomes him. What do you think that means?

Jesus is in all of us. No matter who we are, where we come from, whether we are rich or poor, old or young.

Even the youngest person is special and important because they are loved by God.

Children around the world are different. But each one of them is special and important.

Sophie is ten and lives in El Salvador. She helps to look after her family's chickens – she gives them food and water. She has also been learning how to make tortillas, the type of bread that people in El Salvador eat with every meal.

Rahoume is five years old. She was born in Syria but had to leave when she was two because fighting meant it wasn't safe. She says, "I want to be a nurse. I want to help people." Rahoume likes to play on the swings.

Four-year-old Yamone lives in Jordan. He likes to play, to write and to colour in. When he grows up he wants to be a carpenter. He says, "I want to make a bed. I don't have bed."

What things do you have in common with Sophie, Rahoume and Yamone?

What things do they do or like, that you do or like too?

What will you do this week to show that all people are important no matter who they are?
