Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

This week we hear Jesus talk about the importance of offering someone a cup of water to drink when they are thirsty. Let's think a bit more about this. Can you remember what Jesus says to the disciples about water in the Gospel? Jesus says that anyone who gives them a cup of water to drink, because they are his disciples, will be rewarded in heaven. Why do you think that Jesus says this?

Jesus was sending out the disciples to spread his word. They had to leave their homes and their families behind and they had to rely on other people to welcome them and to share with them, so that they could live. How do you think that must have felt?

It must have been difficult for the disciples. They couldn't just turn on a tap when they were thirsty and get water to drink and they didn't have money to buy food when they were hungry.

Water has many uses and it is really important. We all need water to live.

During this term we will be celebrating our Harvest Festival and so perhaps in the coming weeks, we can do our best to think about sharing what we have, so that all people around the world can have their fair share of the basic things like food and water that we need to live.
