Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

The Gospel reading reminds us of how it is not always easy to follow Jesus or to accept what God wants to happen in our lives. Even Peter, one of Jesus's disciples found it difficult. Let's think some more about this. Jesus asks his friends, the disciples, a question. He asks them who people think he is.

What answer do the disciples give? (*Elijah, John the Baptist*). Jesus then asks the disciples who they think he is. What does Peter say?

Peter believes that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. He has faith in Jesus.

But then Jesus starts to tell the disciples about what will happen to him. That he will suffer and be killed, but that after three days he will rise again. Peter struggles to believe all this - he does not want to believe that his friend, the Son of God, will suffer and die.

Peter feels afraid that Jesus might leave them. And he wants to protect Jesus from harm because he cares about him.

It is sometimes hard to do what God wants us to do, just like it was for Peter, because we are afraid, and we do not want to get hurt, or for those that we love to be hurt.

Jesus tells us that it will not always be easy to follow him, but that we must have courage, because God will always be with us.

Can you think of a time when you were afraid and needed courage?

Some children have to leave their homes because fighting means it is not safe for them to stay. It can be very frightening.

What does it mean to follow Jesus? What can we do to show that we are following Jesus?

Can you think of a time when you have found it difficult to do what you knew was right and follow Jesus? Why was it so difficult?

Will you be brave in the coming week? What will you do over the coming week to show that you follow Jesus?

Helpful Hints/School Guidance

Child's absence/lateness/collection

- Telephone 0207 735 4516 and leave a clear message with child's name, class and reason for absence on the day your child is not in school.
- Children should arrive in school before school starts at 9am when the school gates will close. If your child arrives between 9.00am and 9.10am please take them to the school hall in order to report their attendance.
- Children arriving after 9.10am must report to the school office.
- Children should be collected at 3.30pm the gates open at 3.20pm. Please collect your child on time.
- Report to school before 3pm if someone else is collecting your child and not on the list for collection, giving time for staff to inform the class teacher. All persons collecting must be 15 years of age or older.

Medical/dental appointments

- Where possible schedule appointments for during school holidays or before/after school.
- You need to bring proof of appointment when you inform the school office if taking your child to an appointment during school time.

Vomiting and diarrhoea

- Keep your child at home for at least 48 hours from the last time they have vomited or had diarrhoea to prevent the spread of germs.

Speaking to your child's class teacher/senior leader/head teacher

- Make an appointment through the school office giving reason for appointment and the office staff will arrange an appointment.

It is not appropriate to try and speak to you child's class teacher at 9 o'clock when the children are being led into class.

School Uniform

- Make sure your child is wearing the correct school uniform including PE kit. Ensure every item of uniform is clearly marked with your child's name either by name label or permanent marker. Check regularly that your child has his/her uniform (mistakes can be made)
- School uniform can be ordered through the school website.

Office Opening times

- The office is open for general enquires, school payments etc from 8.30am to 9.30am and again from 3.00pm to 4.00pm.

PE kits, musical instruments etc

- Children should bring PE kits in on a Monday morning and keep them at school until Friday when they can be brought home to be washed. Musical instruments and other items i.e. packed lunches, homework, club snacks etc should all be brought in by your child at the beginning of the day. The office staff are not able to make class deliveries and cannot guarantee they will arrive in class on time for the lesson/club.

School email

- Reply slips, absence reporting and urgent correspondence unfortunately could miss deadlines due to emails not being open in time. Please use appropriate systems in place i.e. leave message on phone re absence, send in reply slips via class teacher or as stated on letter etc.

Playground equipment

- Due to health and safety, children should not play on playground equipment before or after school.

Birthdays

- Please do not send in a birthday cake on your child's birthday. If you wish your child to share treats, please only send in a box of Heroes to share.

NUT FREE SCHOOL

NO nuts in school of any kind, this includes parents/carers/visitors coming into our school/playground. We have children in our school with severe nut allergies. A serious reaction suffered by an allergic child can result in death. Remember that birthday treats for your child to share should only be Heroes chocolates as they do not contain nuts.
